

Tips for Removing Stains

Regularly clean the decking with clean soapy water to remove any dirt or soiling as it may become more difficult to remove if it has been in place over a period of time.

If it is necessary to remove stains, we recommend test cleaning a small area initially to ensure the suitability of the cleaning products being used and that it has no adverse effect on the decking.

Types of stains	Solution
Dust and Dirt	Use a hard brush dipped in warm soapy water to remove it.
Mildew	Scrub with bleach or a mold remover (suitable for wood), then rinse.
Ice or Snow	Apply calcium chloride or rock salt, it can melt ice or snow. Then you can use hot soapy water to wash it.
Soil and Dirt	Apply a detergent containing oxalic acid or phosphoric acid. Rub the stain for 10-15 minutes.
Greasy and Oil-Based Stains	Immediately clean with household Grease removal products and hot soapy water.
Wine or Juice	Use a mix of bleach-based stain remover and hot soapy water to dilute the stain and wipe up.
Ink	Apply a mix a bleach and hot soapy water to ink spills to dilute and wipe up immediately. It may not be possible to fully remove ink stains.
